form	conditional sentence (if-clause) present tense result (main clause): - simple present, - present continuous, - modals - imperatives	if-clause: present tense main clause: - will-future, - going to-future - modal verbs - imperatives	if-clause: simple past main clause: would/ could/ should + infinite of verb	if-clause: past perfect (had + past participle) main clause: would(n't)/ could(n't)/ should(n't) + have + past participle
use	used to express factual conditions, e.g. - general truths - facts - common events - habits.	used to express factual conditions in the future. The result is certain or likely to happen in the future.	used to express that a condition is possible but very unlikely to be fulfilled.	used to describe situations that are - untrue (never happened) - unreal (imaginary) - disappointing (regrettable) - cannot be changed anymore because they happened in the past
