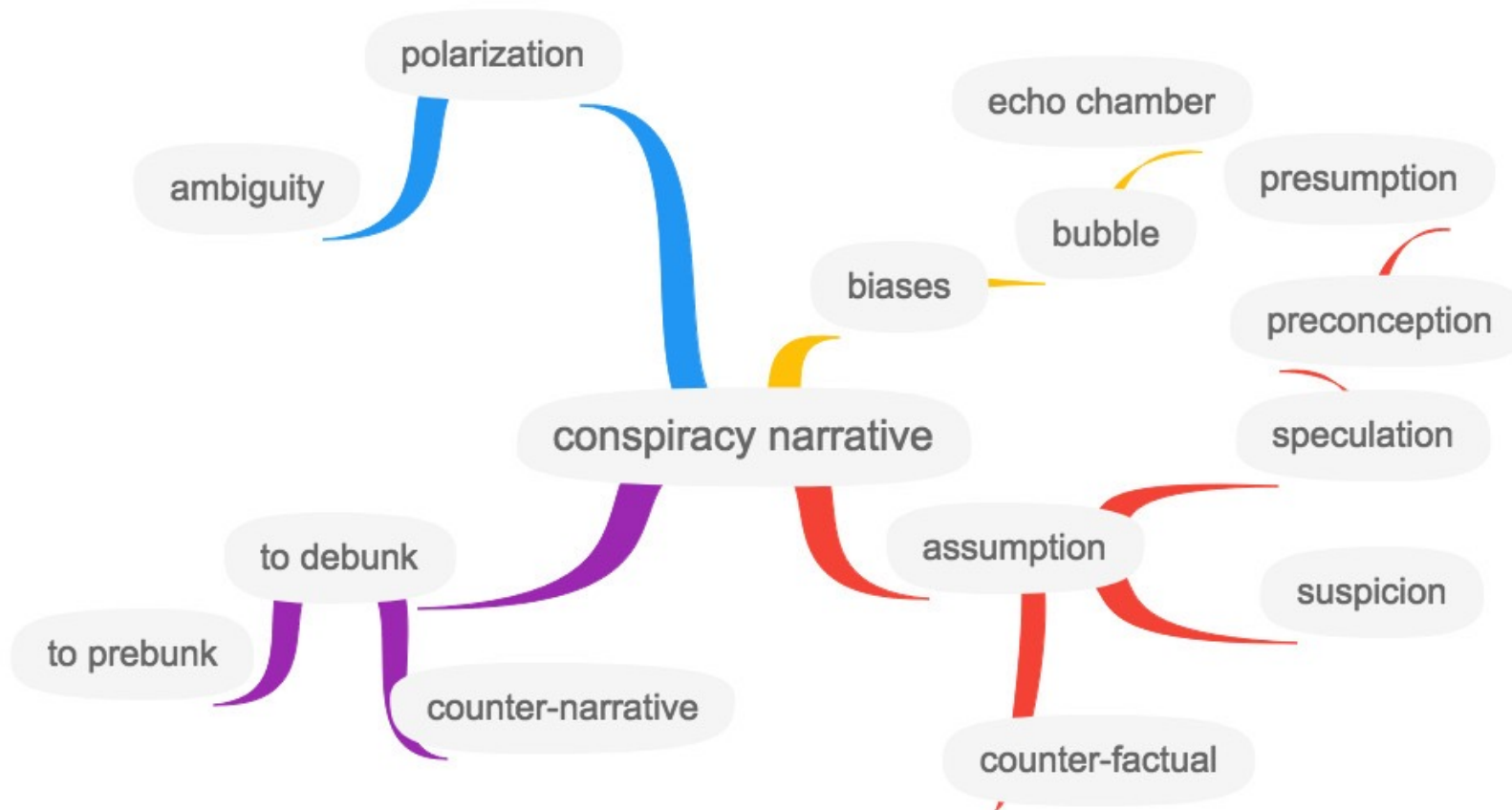
The conspiracy narrative		specific examples
	has an alleged, secret plot.	
	involves a group of conspirators.	
	uses 'evidence' that seems to support the conspiracy theory.	
	"falsely suggests that nothing happens by accident and that there are no coincidences; nothing is as it appears and everything is connected.	
	divides the world into good or bad.	
	scapegoats people and groups.	
The author	is a self-proclaimed expert and not attached to a reputable organisation or institution	
	claims to have credentials but they don't withstand scrutiny or are suspended	
	presents their information as the only valid truth	
	raises questions instead of providing answers	
	demonises whoever they assume is behind the alleged secret plot	
The source of information	is not clear	
	Independent fact-checking websites do not support the source and have refuted related claims	
The information	is shared only by self-proclaimed experts	
The tone	is subjective, emotionally charged	
	Emotional images or anecdotes are used to illustrate the message"
